This product will polymerise immediately in the mouth. Ensure breathing passages are

not obstructed. Contact a doctor.

Eye contact

Do not force eye open. If the eye is bonded closed, release eye lashes with warm water by covering with wet pad. Ethyl cyanoacrylate will bond to eye protein and will cause watering of the eye which will help to debond the adhesive. Keep eye covered until debonding is complete, usually 1-3 days. Seek medical advice.

Skin contact

Do not force bonded skin apart. Wash affect area gently in warm water. Skin may be gentle peeled away from adhesive. If irritation or painful, seek medical advice. Large amounts of ethyl cyanoacrylate may cause burns as heat is given off during

solidification. If skin rash occurs, seek medical advice.

Inhaled

IF INHALED: Remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for

breathing. Call a doctor if you feel unwell.
